## THE FEAST OF CREATION

A new liturgical feast in Western denominations



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#### September 1

Known as "Creation Day", "Feast of Creation" or "World Day of Prayer for Creation".

**First day of the liturgical calendar** of Eastern Orthodox churches (aka Feast of the Indiction)

#### **GROUNDED IN ANCIENT TRADITION**



The Eastern Church celebrates September 1 since the 5th century.

Among other things, September 1 represents "the day of Creation", when God began the creation of the universe.

Thus, it is the **first day of the liturgical year** of Orthodox and Catholic byzantine churches.

Sharing the concern of my beloved brother, Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew, for the future of creation (cf. <u>Laudato Si'</u>, 7-9), and at the suggestion of his representative, Metropolitan loannis of Pergamum, who took part in the presentation of the Encyclical <u>Laudato Si'</u> on care for our common home, I wish to inform you that I have decided to institute in the Catholic Church the "World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation" which, beginning this year, is to be celebrated on 1 September, as has been the custom in the Orthodox Church for some time.

# CREATION DAY: MUCH DEEPER THAN MOST PEOPLE THINK

- Not only a 'World Day of Prayer for Creation' (dozens of such days on random themes; Grandparents, Human Trafficking, Vocations, the Church in China, Sanctification of Priests, etc).
- Creation Day has much **deeper theological underpinnings**. Grounded in an ancient tradition of the Orthodox Church, it is a day to:
  - commemorate the theological mystery of Creation
  - honor God as Creator

Two different **meanings of the word "Creation"**. In Italian, distinct words are used:

- "la Creazione" stands for God's act of creation of heaven and earth.
  - i.e. Creation as theological mystery.

• "il Creato" stands for the result of the act of creation, the fruit of la Creazione.

i.e. Creation as the created world.

(Which, by reminding us of its source and sacredness, can also inspire care for the created world)

# THE PROCESS TO ENHANCE THE FEAST IN WESTERN DENOMINATIONS

#### PROPOSAL: "UPGRADE" TO LITURGICAL FEAST

- Despite its growing popularity and rich theological underpinnings, it is still
  absent from liturgical calendars of Western denominations. So a proposal
  emerged to "upgrade" Creation day to become a liturgical feast in Western calendars.
- Ecumenical process underway co-sponsored by World Council of Churches
   (umbrella for Orthodox and Protestant churches) and Protestant denominations,
   accompanied by the Orthodox Church and in dialogue with the Vatican.









#### PROTESTANT CHURCHES: CONFIRMED TO GO AHEAD


Worldwide churches co-sponsoring the process (Anglican, Lutheran, Methodist, Reformed) confirmed their desire for a "Joint statement of intent".

**When?** September 2025 (Nicaea centenary).

*How?* Add to their **Common Lectionary** (RCL\*).

Then implement nationally.

\* The Consultation on Common Texts (ecumenical liturgical body in charge of Revised Common Lectionary) already set up a committee to add the new feast.



#### **CATHOLIC CHURCH: UNDERGOING CONSULTATIONS**


Following an encouraging <u>statement</u>, Dicastery for Divine Worship clarified the **next step**: **requests** for the feast **from bishops' conferences** and others.

**1. Synodal approach**, which – before taking a step at global level – would first be sure that there is a desire from local churches and the People of God.

2. Precedent of recent "new feasts", preceded by requests to the Vatican from various corners of the Church.

E.g. Feast of Holy Family (1921), Feast of Christ the King (1925), Feast of Christ the Priest (2012), etc
